The »Macroeconomics and Financial Markets« research cluster consists of the research department Macroeconomics, the focus departments for Forecasting and Economic Policy and Development and Security and International Economics. All departments have a quantitative empirical orientation using modern econometric methods in common. Depending on the content, the work is based on either microeconomic or macroeconomic approaches.

In addition to empirical studies, theoretical statements about the market development are derived using approaches based on competition policy and behavioral economics. The empirical and theoretical findings are useful for evaluating the effect of various political instruments.
