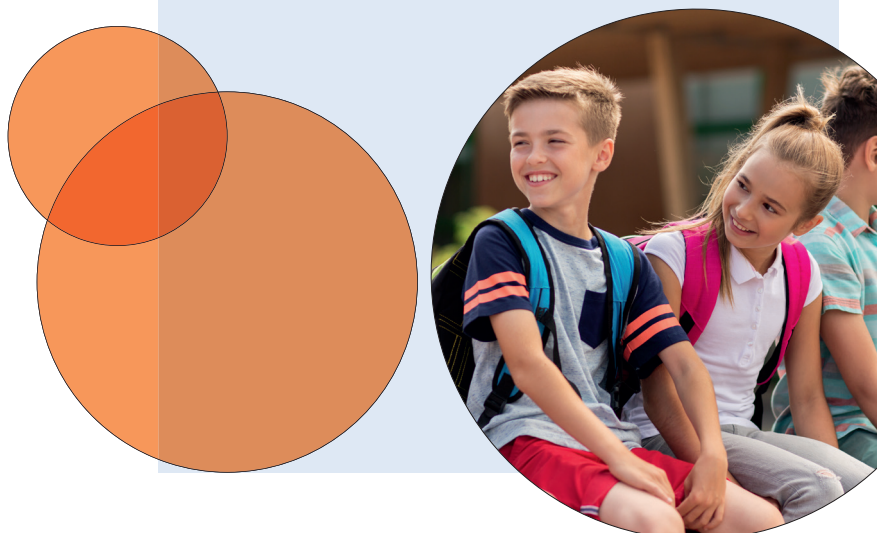

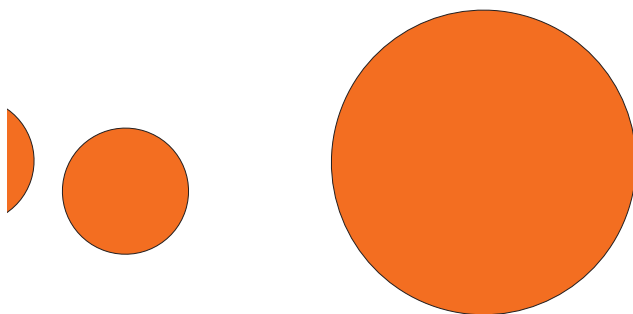

You can think of it like that: If something is at the bottom or does not apply at all, you are on the lowest step. If something is at the top or fully true, you are on the top step. Sometimes something is true, but only more or less, then you are on one of the steps in between.
